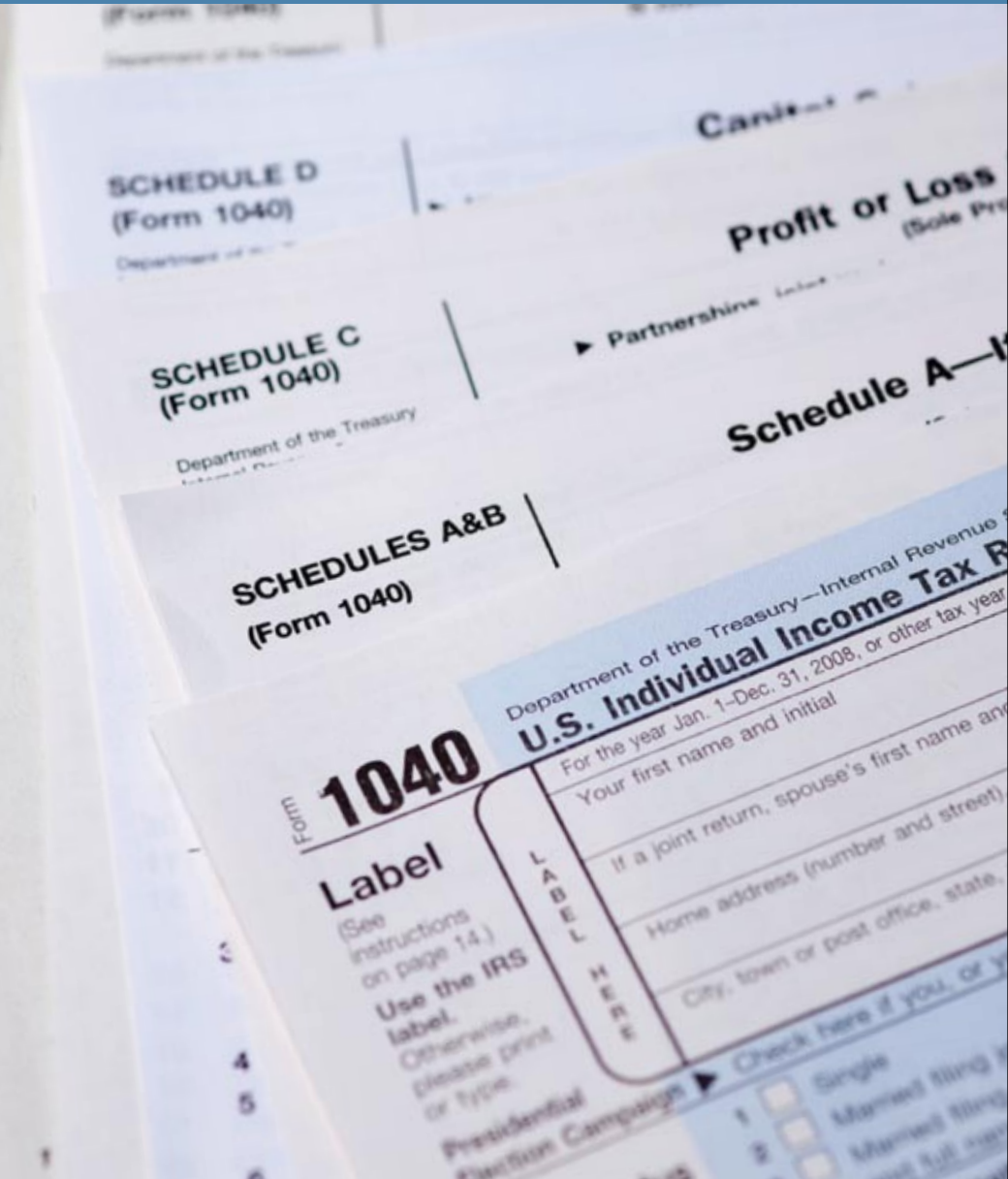

Dear Colleague:

As the Director of Georgetown Law's Graduate Tax Program, I invite you to participate next February in the Taxation Interview Program (TIP), the nation's premier job fair for graduate tax students. Georgetown Law is again partnering with New York University School of Law (NYU) to sponsor this job fair, which enables private and public sector employers to interview, on one day and in one place, some of the most promising young tax professionals in the country. This year's program is scheduled for Friday, February 26, 2010, at the Embassy Suites Hotel, 900 Tenth Street, NW, in Washington, D.C.

As in prior years, employers will have the opportunity to pre-screen resumes and to select the specific candidates they wish to interview. The candidate pool will include:

- Tax LL.M. candidates from Georgetown Law and NYU, including both U.S.- and foreign-trained lawyers. Most are pursuing their degrees as full-time students, but some part-time candidates will also be available for interview.
- Tax LL.M. graduates from Georgetown Law and NYU who are now in their final year as law clerks for Judges of the U.S. Tax Court.
- Georgetown Law and NYU students enrolled in the J.D./LL.M. joint degree program in Taxation.
- Georgetown Law students enrolled for the Certificate in Employee Benefits and the Certificate in Estate Planning programs.

Employers will be able to register and manage their accounts online through Symplicity for the 2010 edition of TIP. The deadline for submitting the online registration form to participate in the 2010 Taxation Interview Program is Thursday, January 21, 2010. Resumes will be available for review by Wednesday, January 27, 2010. The deadline to provide us with your interview selections is Monday, February 8, 2010. If you are not able to interview in person at TIP, but wish to receive resumes from interested students, you can indicate this on your registration form by selecting the resume collection option.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Since 2001, TIP has been the nation's flagship program for the recruitment of graduate tax students, featuring employer schedules representing law firms, government agencies and the major accounting firms from around the country. This year's TIP will take place on **Friday, February 26, 2010**, at the Embassy Suites Hotel in Washington, D.C.

100% Employer Pre-Screened

TIP is a 100% pre-screened program. Employers submit a job description and request resumes and other application materials (cover letter, J.D. and LL.M. transcripts) in the online system. These requirements are communicated directly to students, who will then be aware of the employer's hiring criteria. Employers must provide Georgetown Law with candidate and alternate selections in the online system by **Monday, February 8, 2010**.

Employers may choose to have 20-minute or 30-minute interview slots.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Employers can register online to attend and interview at TIP, or simply collect resumes from participating students. The TIP online registration and interview scheduling system will remain open until **Thursday, January 21, 2010**, and is available at: <https://law-tip-csm.symphlicity.com/employers/>. This automated online system allows employers to register for multiple offices, manage their schedule format with ease, and specify precise hiring criteria.

Fees are due upon registration. Interview Location

TIP will take place on **Friday, February 26, 2010**, at the Embassy Suites Hotel (900 Tenth Street, N.W., in Washington, D.C.). Employers are responsible for making their own reservations and for all hotel expenses. Program participants receive a special, discounted hotel rate of \$266.00 (per single room, depending on availability) for reservations made prior to Monday, January 26, 2010. If you check out of your room by 6:00 p.m. on Friday, February 26, 2010, you will only be charged a half-day rate for that day. In order to get this rate and/or half-day arrangement, please mention the code "GWL."

GEORGETOWN LAW

Georgetown Law's innovative and highly-ranked Graduate Tax Program offers the richest curriculum of tax courses nationwide, taught by distinguished full-time and adjunct tax faculty numbering more than 100 professors.

Diverse Curriculum and Faculty

Courses range from basic corporate tax to taxation of derivatives; from basic international tax to advanced transfer pricing; from basic partnership tax to structuring complex venture capital transactions. Our adjunct faculty includes officials from all three branches of government: the U.S. Tax Court, the tax-writing committees of Congress, the Internal Revenue Service, and the U.S. Department of Treasury, including Eric Solomon, the Assistant Secretary for Tax Policy.

Students and Graduates

The 2009 entering class consists of 176 graduate tax students, most of whom attend full-time. Sixteen students are pursuing the Certificate in Employee Benefits Law, and another 31 are pursuing the Certificate in Estate Planning, generally in conjunction with the Tax LL.M. degree. The class includes 23 foreign-trained lawyers, many of whom have practiced in major firms abroad or in their respective governmental tax agencies. The depth of our curriculum — including more than a dozen international tax courses — enables students to concentrate and develop specialized skills in niche areas of tax law, so they can hit the ground running when they enter practice.

Academic Requirements

Georgetown Law places great emphasis on helping students develop their legal writing skills. Many students complete research papers in seminars or as graduate independent research. We offer drafting and workshop courses that entail practice-based writing assignments such as research memos and client letters. Students can enhance their writing skills by serving in editorial positions for *The Tax Lawyer*.

The Graduate Tax Program at New York University School of Law (NYU), established in 1945, is the oldest program of its kind in the nation. Students and Graduates

Students of NYU's Graduate Tax Program include top graduates from across the United States and over 20 countries. Graduates join a network of over 10,000 prominent members of private tax practice, government, the judiciary, and academia. Students whose first law degree is from outside of the U.S. may join our general Graduate Tax Program or apply to the prestigious International Tax Program for Foreign Students.

Academic Requirements and Curriculum

Located in the nation's financial center, NYU provides an academically rigorous curriculum which offers students a choice of over 50 different tax courses. Courses are taught by 13 full-time tax faculty, two acting assistant professors, visiting faculty members, and 35 adjunct faculty, who consistently strive to be innovative, flexible and responsive to our students' needs as well as the needs of the marketplace. Students may choose from concentrations in general business taxation, international taxation, estate planning, and tax policy. By combining required policy training with specialized courses, NYU students graduate with a superior ability to understand tax legislation and the underpinnings of complex tax transactions. In addition, several students receive scholarships to serve as editors on the *Tax Law Review* and fellowships offering six month internships at the Treasury Department and the Joint Committee on Taxation.
