⁹ *The Georgetown Law Journal* selects its members in three different ways:

- 1) 40% of our new members will be selected solely on the basis of their Write-On packet scores.
- 2) 40% of our new members will be selected on the basis of a formula that weighs Write-On scores and grades equally.
- 3) 20% of our new members will be selected solely on the basis of a Personal Statement, provided that they have reached a certain threshold score on their Write-On submission. Although the exact threshold score will vary from year to year, dependent on both the number of candidates who participate in the Write-On Competition and the number of candidates who rank the GLJ as their first choice, generally candidates must score within the top third of Write-On submissions.

Please note that for each of the above selection methods we will only consider selecting students who have preferred *The Georgetown Law Journal* as their first choice.
