**Accommodations Available\*:**

- Reduced Course Load
- Use of tape recorder or assistive listening devices in lectures
- Audio tape recording of classes
- Use of a notetaker
- Readers
- Tutors
- Books and course materials on tape/CD
- Enlarged print materials
- Liaison service with Recording for the Blind and Dyslexic
- Provision of sign language interpreters
- Exam accommodations (e.g. extended time, taped format, use of a word processor)
- Parking Space
- Special desk/seating arrangement in classroom

\* Please note that a request for accommodations does not assure the receipt of these services as this decision will be made by the Disabilities Services Coordinator and Dean of Students based on documentation provided by the student.

**Requesting Accommodations:**

Students are responsible for identifying themselves to the Law Center's staff and informing them of their need for specific services and accommodations in sufficient time to allow for their coordination. Students are required to provide appropriate and current documentation of their disabilities. In some instances, it may be necessary to provide additional documentation to receive specific services or accommodations.

**Student Housing:**
