As an international student interested in attending the Georgetown University Law Center, you should be aware that you are expected to have sufficient funding to finance your entire course of study. The Law Center does not offer grants or scholarships to international students. Therefore, international students will need to obtain funding through personal resources, government or private funding.

The library is connected to the U.S. Embassy in the capital city, and there may be branch libraries in U.S. consulates located in other cities.
