Welcome to the *LL.M. in Taxation Interview Program (TIP)*. This year's Program will be held on Friday, February 24, 2006. Since 2000, employers nationwide have used TIP to meet their hiring needs efficiently.

TIP is co-hosted by Georgetown University Law Center and New York University School of Law. This format allows employers to select candidates from a combined pool of highly qualified LL.M. students.

THE PROGRAM

100% Employer Pre-Screened.

TIP allows employers to pre-screen student resumes, transcripts, and writing samples, and to select only those candidates whom they wish to interview.

Online Registration.

Employers may register for TIP online by following the Registration link from the TIP website (<http://clik.to/TIP>). Our automated online registration process allows employers to register for multiple offices, manage their schedule format with ease, and specify precise hiring criteria. If your preferences change later on, simply submit a new registration form.

Flat Participation Fee.

The registration fee of \$300 remains fixed, whether you request one interview schedule for a single office, or multiple schedules for your offices nationwide. (Not refundable after 1/27/06.)

Employers are invited to join us for a buffet luncheon during their scheduled lunch break on February 24.

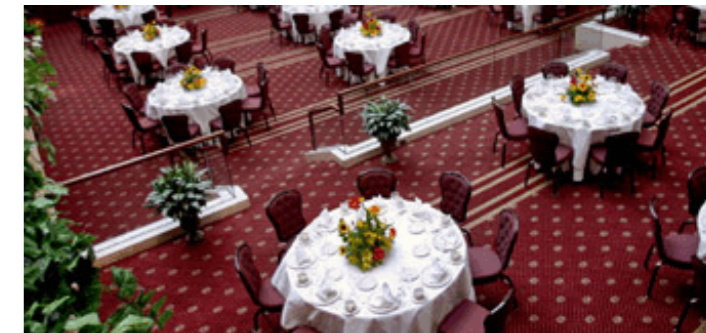
Hosted at the Washington Court Hotel



Interviews are held at the Washington Court Hotel in Washington, DC. Employers are responsible for making their own reservations, and for all hotel expenses. Program participants receive a special, discounted room rate of \$205 for reservations made prior to the January 27th deadline.

Reservations should be made in the name of the employer – *not* in the name of your recruitment coordinator or interviewing attorney – and must be made for the night of Thursday, February 23, 2006. Interviewers will be given a late checkout time of 6:00 p.m. on Friday, February 24, so that reservations need only be for one night. Be sure to reserve one room for each interview schedule, and to identify yourself as a participant in the Taxation Interview Program.

Interviews will take place in the interviewer's hotel room. Please note that employers may not interview in their DC office, as student schedules will not permit travel outside of the hotel on the Program date.
