Job Postings

We can arrange for job postings to be listed on Symplicity, the law school's regularly updated online jobs database. Symplicity is accessible to current J.D. and LL.M. students and alumni. Resume Collections

We can organize resume collections to suit your hiring needs at any time. Simply contact us with details of the position you wish to fill and we will contact students, collect their responses and forward their materials to you. Resume collections are completely pre-screened by the employer.

On-Campus Interviews

We can arrange on-campus interviews if you wish to interview LL.M. students in Washington, D.C. In the past, we have organized on-campus interviews for private law firms, corporations, government agencies, international and non-governmental organizations, as well as accounting and consulting firms.

Videoconferencing Facilities

Videoconferencing facilities are available for employers located outside the Washington, D.C. area who wish to interview our LL.M. students.

Employer Recruitment Programs

We facilitate the following employer recruitment programs annually:

1. The Taxation Interview Program (TIP) is held in Washington, D.C., each year in early March in collaboration with New York University School of Law. At TIP, employers have the opportunity to interview U.S.-trained and foreign-trained LL.M. students studying Taxation as well as those studying for Employee Benefits, Estate Planning or the State and Local Taxation Certificates on a stand-alone basis. It is completely pre-screened by employers.
2. The International Student Interview Program (ISIP) is held in New York at the end of January each year, in conjunction with New York University School of Law and 31 other law schools in the United States. Foreign-trained LL.M. students from all of our degree and certificate programs are eligible to participate in ISIP. It is completely pre-screened by employers.
3. We have liaised with employers to organize individual "meet and greet" panels and other networking events both on- and off-campus.
