



**Certificate in
World Trade Organization (WTO) Studies
Requirements for 2009-2010**

The Institute of International Economic Law (IIEL) at Georgetown University Law Center offers the opportunity for Georgetown Law students to obtain a certificate testifying to special competence in World Trade Organization (WTO) studies in addition to their respective degrees. The certificate is not a diploma and it does not change the title of the degree students are pursuing at Georgetown Law.

The WTO Studies Certificate is generally available to students earning a J.D. or LL.M. at the Law Center. Students earning an S.J.D. at the Law Center, and students earning graduate degrees in other related subjects at Georgetown University who are eligible to enroll in courses at the Law Center, may obtain the WTO Studies Certificate only by permission of the Institute of International Economic Law. Students must complete all of their degree requirements to receive a WTO certificate. Students will **not** be admitted solely for the WTO Studies Certificate program.

The following are requirements for the WTO Studies Certificate:

- Successful completion of a basic international law course, either at the Law Center or elsewhere, is a *prerequisite* for the WTO Studies Certificate, and this qualifying course does not count toward the 12 credits required for the WTO Studies Certificate.
- Students who wish to pursue the WTO Studies Certificate must do so by submitting the attached [Notification Form](#) to the Law Center's Institute of International Economic Law (IIEL) by the end of the second week of classes in the first semester of graduate studies, or, for J.D. students, by the end of the second week of classes in the first semester of their second year.
- To receive the WTO Studies Certificate, students must successfully complete **12 elective credits*** of coursework on WTO-related subjects, selected from the attached [list of courses](#) identified as eligible for the WTO Studies Certificate and posted at <http://www.law.georgetown.edu/iiel/students/wtocertificate/index.html>).
- Students must maintain an overall grade point average of "B" (3.0) or higher.
- Students must complete a research paper on a WTO law subject approved by the IIEL.
- Students must participate in four activities related to international trade during their course of study (such as attending a conference, congressional, administrative or court hearing, or other similar event).

***Note:** Academic credit transferred from other institutions and/or graduate programs will *not* count toward the 12 credits required for the WTO Studies Certificate.

Frequently Asked Questions: Certificate in WTO Studies

Course Selection

1. My course schedule is only tentative. I might drop some of the courses I have selected or might add others. What shall I do?

Please include in your notification all the courses you have currently selected and which fulfill the course requirements of the certificate. We will request an updated notification prior to your graduation and will review your final transcript to verify whether you fulfill the requirements.

2. I am on the wait list for some of the courses that would fulfill the requirement. Can I include them in the notification anyway?

Yes you can. Please be aware though, that you will have to fulfill all WTO Certificate requirements to get the Certificate. If you do not get in the course and you need it for the Certificate, you will have to add another eligible course to your schedule.

3. How will you verify that I have taken the courses which I have indicated on my notification?

We will request verification of your final transcript from the Registrar.

Administration of the Certificate

1. I am an evening student. When do I have to submit my notification?

As an evening student you have to submit your notification at least four semesters before you graduate. For example, if you finish your studies within 7 semesters, you must notify the IIEL by the end of the first week of the 3rd semester.

2. I am a part-time LL.M. student. When do I have to submit my notification?

As a part-time LL.M. student you have to submit your notification at least two semesters before you graduate. For example, if you finish your studies within 3 semesters, you must notify the IIEL by the end of the first week of your second semester.

3. How will you verify that I have fulfilled the requirement for extracurricular activities?

IIEL will ask you to send a list of the events that you attended.

4. When and how will I get the Certificate?

Your transcript will indicate that you earned the WTO Certificate, and the Certificate will be presented to you at graduation when you receive your diploma.
