PROGRAM DETAILS

Admission Requirements

Space is limited to enhance each person's learning experience. This program is designed primarily for international and U.S. professionals already possessing a basic background in WTO and GATT matters. However, those who are new to the subject are welcome to attend, and introductory readings will be recommended for them before entering the intensive week of instruction.

Hours of Instruction

Classes will begin each day at 8:30 AM. Each afternoon from 5:00 to 6:30 PM, there will be a panel discussion with experienced WTO practitioners and well-recognized academics. The Academy will include an Opening Reception on the first day from 6:30 to 8:00 PM, and luncheon discussions on topical issues such as the Impact of China's WTO Accession. The Academy also will include optional evening workshops on Researching International Trade Law and WTO Litigation Practice.

Languages

The language of instruction is English. Participants are expected to have significant ability to read, speak and understand English.

Visa

If you will require a visa to attend, please note that it is your responsibility to obtain the visa and to allow sufficient time to process all requisite paperwork. Substitutions

Substitutions of participants affiliated with the same institution are accepted at any time prior to commencement of the program on October 29, 2007.

Certificate of Attendance

A Certificate of Attendance is available upon completion of the program for those persons attending at least 80% of the Academy.

Cancellations and Refunds

Registrants who are unable to attend the Academy must provide written notice of their intent to cancel to the Academy Program Officer, Christine Washington, at iielacademy@law.georgetown.edu. Cancellation notices must be received by September 15, 2007 in order to receive full tuition reimbursement, less a \$150 administrative fee.

Registrants who cancel before September 22, 2007 may receive half tuition reimbursement, less a \$150 administrative fee.

Registrants who must withdraw from the program because of an emergency or inability to receive a visa may request a partial refund of tuition (up to \$500 of total tuition) if they provide written notice of the necessity to withdraw to the Academy Program Officer by October 1, 2007. Any refund requests relating to circumstances that arise after this date will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

Individuals who register for the program, space allowing, after September 15, 2007, and who find themselves unable to attend, or who register after October 1, 2007, space allowing, and find themselves unable to attend for a reason other than emergency or visa constraints, should immediately contact the Program Officer. Any refund requests relating to circumstances that arise after these dates will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

CLE Credit

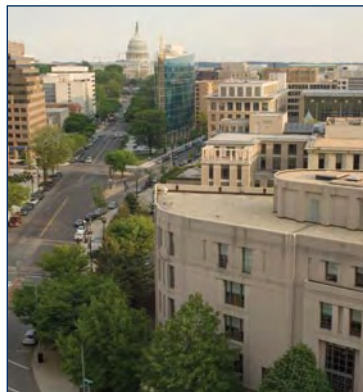
