Georgetown University Law Library is seeking applications for the newly created position of Instructional Technology Librarian.

Located in the nation's capital and within walking distance of the U.S. Congress and the Supreme Court, Georgetown University Law Center is known for the quality of its scholarship, the teaching of its faculty, which is among the largest in the nation, and for its talented and diverse student body. The Law Library consists of the Edward Bennett Williams Law Library and the John Wolff International and Comparative Law Library. Under the direct supervision of the Associate Law Librarian for Electronic Resources and Services, the Instructional Technology Librarian is focused on developing, tracking and supporting instructional tools and training others in their use to deliver effective technology-enhanced learning experiences. This position focuses on tools for online learning, supported through assessment and evaluation. Leveraging legal subject knowledge, the Instructional Technology Librarian provides meaningful interaction between research librarians, law students and others using the Law Library's research services. This position provides leadership in developing tools to strengthen information literacy skills, enhancing pedagogical methods, and integrating learning objects across all relevant platforms. The Instructional Technology Librarian plays a critical role in providing and supporting technology-enhanced instruction, including training others and implementing new instructional initiatives.

The Instructional Technology Librarian is also expected to participate actively in the intellectual life and administrative activities of the Law Center, to fulfill the responsibilities of the position in a superior manner, and to grow professionally in knowledge, expertise, effectiveness, and where appropriate, scholarship.

Required:

Master's degree from an ALA-accredited school of library and/or information studies or equivalent education or experience; at least three years of professional experience working with instructional technologies to support teaching or training; at least one year experience in a legal setting, such as a law library, law firm or related field; experience in training or teaching, especially through the use of advanced technologies; strong working knowledge of instructional technologies, including major presentation tools, and emerging technologies that can support classroom instruction, as well as remote or asynchronous instruction; familiarity with library operations; excellent communication skills.

Preferred:

Degree in instructional design or technology; J.D. from an ABA-accredited law school or other legal training.
