

Land Use Legal Intern

The National Association of Home Builders (NAHB) is seeking a legal intern to assist attorneys in developing a legal resource database on land use issues. The legal intern will research and analyze case law on various land use topics; assist in identifying key legal issues within the body of case law for each topic; draft summaries of cases for attorney review; assist with management of documents related to topics; and assist with drafting white papers on topics for future publication. Topics include, but are not limited to, exactions and impact fees, vested rights and development agreements, growth controls and moratoria; eminent domain and inverse condemnation; inclusionary and exclusionary zoning; and substantive due process.

Legal intern candidate will have strong research and writing skills, have completed a basic land use course in law school, and have a keen interest in the subject matter. (Concurrent enrollment in a basic land use course with other experience will be considered.) Intermediate typing and MS Office computer skills also required.

Part-time position from September 2006 - December 2006 is unpaid. Law school credit hours may be earned.
