Call types:	Low-acuity mental health crisis calls that do not pose a threat of violence nor involve a medical emergency, welfare checks, and additional calls at SPD officer request
Staff:	20 to 30 employees
Training:	Training over the course of 4 weeks includes basic life support, de-escalation, context of alternative response, mental health first aid, cultural awareness, and trauma-informed care
Calls responded to per month:	
Dispatch Process:	CARE operates the 911 Emergency Call Center, and can dispatch crisis responders individually or with police presence, 24/7. Seattle Police Department patrol officers can also request a CCR team response.
