OVERVIEW

Convened by Georgetown Law's Center for Innovations in Community Safety, the Community Safety Leadership Institute (CSLI) is a national fellowship program that invests in the people leading community crisis response (CCR) work. CSLI seeks to continue to advance the field of CCR and support the national community safety movement by:

- Deepening participants' leadership, management, and strategic capacity
- Facilitating mentorship, peer learning, and information exchange
- Building an advocacy network led by CCR practitioners

PROGRAM STRUCTURE HIGHLIGHTS

Application Process	• Applications submitted to CICS • Requirements: ◦ Programs must include a CCR function (other community safety functions encouraged) ◦ Senior leadership track staff ◦ Must agree to time commitment
Cohort Size	• 24 CSLI Fellows ◦ Up to 2 leaders from 12 programs
Duration and Time Commitment	• One year total length (Jan – Dec 2027) • Monthly cohort meeting • Quarterly executive coaching • Capstone work • Other networking
Format	• Hybrid of online sessions with at least one in-person convening. • 1:1 coaching
Cost to Participants	• No program fees
Applied Capstone	• Participants plan a program-specific or field-wide project of their choosing to complete over the course of the cohort year, advised by CICS staff.
Fellowship Certificate	• Participants will receive a Georgetown Law CSLI Fellowship Certificate of Completion after meeting all participation requirements.
