ACADEMICS

This section provides a summary of some important academic information. Please refer to the <u>Academics</u> page of the CTLS website for further details.

Course Selection

We recommend that students study between 12 and 16 credits. This includes the required courses, which are worth a total of 4 credits. Students must study a minimum of 10 credits, and the maximum permitted is 17. (Please note that the maximum number permitted for Georgetown students is 14 credits).

Academic Evaluation

The Center for Transnational Legal Studies awards the grades from 5.0 (highest score) to 1.0 (failing score), in 0.5 increments for all its courses, with the exception of the Transnational Law Colloquium and Lectures in Transnational Justice, and the Global Practice exercise, which are graded on a Pass or Fail basis.

- The grading processes for examinations are anonymous and are designed to be as fair as possible.
- All in-class exams are handwritten.
- There are no exam resits under any circumstances.

Faculty members are asked to submit grades approximately four weeks after the end of an examination period. Grades will not be released for any student who has an outstanding student account balance. CTLS will not release grades over the telephone or via email, even to the student, because of concern for students' privacy.

Once a faculty member has submitted student grades, the grade may change only upon written proof of demonstrable clerical error in the grading or grade reporting process.

CTLS is not a degree-granting institution. Students who successfully complete the program are awarded a "Certificate in Transnational Legal Studies". The Certificate bears the names of the Center's Partner Schools and is signed by the Academic Co-Directors of the relevant academic year and Dean Treanor (Georgetown Law).

CTLS will provide each student with a Georgetown Law Center transcript showing their CTLS courses. Each participating school will be permitted to translate or transfer the grades to its own system in the way it deems appropriate.

Class Attendance and Access to Recordings:

The distinctive CTLS course contents and methods mean that attendance and active participation in classes is required for students' academic success, and for the success of the program as a whole. Accordingly, attendance at CTLS classes is mandatory. Please refer to the <u>CTLS Attendance Policy</u> for further information.

Audio recordings of graded classes will only be provided in exceptional circumstances, at the discretion of the CTLS directors, or in cases where students have approved accommodations for disability. Please refer to the <u>Disability Services</u> webpage for more information.

TRAVEL AND TRANSPORTATION

Getting Around London

Transport for London: TfL Website

The Transport for London Journey Planner is one of the best ways to plan any journey within London's public transport network. The Journey Planner will show you the quickest route via the London Underground (Tube) network, or via bus or local National Rail services.

Oyster Cards:

Oyster is a smartcard which can hold pay as you go credit, Travelcard and Bus & Tram Pass season tickets. You can use it to travel on bus, Tube, tram, DLR, London Overground, TfL Rail, Emirates Air Line, River Bus services and most National Rail services in London. Oyster is also the cheapest way to pay for public transport in London.

18+ Student Oyster Card

Student Oyster Cards give you 30% off the price of adult-rate Travelcards and Bus & Tram Pass season tickets. Bear in mind that if you only make a few journeys, you may not need a Travelcard or Bus & Tram Pass and you may be better off using pay as you go at the adult rate.

To register for your 18+ Student Oyster card go to: <u>18+ Student Oyster Card Application</u> Select Create web account to apply online. You will be asked to choose your establishment. Click on CTLS and follow the links.

Our establishment registration number is 9228, make sure you fill this in. You will also need to fill in your GoCard number (<u>not</u> your King's College student ID) and indicate that you are a full-time student. Applications are reviewed regularly and once accepted, cards are sent out by mail within a few working days. Please note, we cannot accept end dates more than two weeks after the last day of the CTLS semester.

Taxis: TfL Taxis and Minicabs

If you decide to use a taxi in London, be sure to take only licensed (black) cabs or licensed private hire vehicles. All licensed taxis must display their license. More information on the this can be found on the Transport for London website at the link above.

Please note that only black cabs can be hailed on the street or on a taxi rank in London. All other taxis must be pre-booked and must send you a booking confirmation, which could be by text message, app, email or - if you're in a minicab office - paper receipt. If the driver or the car picking you up isn't the same as in your booking confirmation, don't get in the car - it isn't safe.

Never use an unbooked minicab.

Getting Around the UK

National Rail:

The <u>National Rail Website</u> allows you to plan journeys and buy advance tickets for rail journeys throughout the UK. It is often much cheaper to buy tickets in advance than at a station.

By Bus:

Bus travel is a cheaper but slower alternative to the rail. The <u>Check My Bus Website</u> compares bus and coach tickets throughout the UK and Europe.

Railcards: UK Railcards Website

The 16-25 Railcard is available for those aged 16-25 and mature students aged 26 or over and in fulltime education. There is also the 26-30 Railcard, available for those aged 26-30. Both railcards are available to purchase online and give you 1/3 off rail fares within the UK. A railcard is definitely worthwhile if you plan to travel outside of London.

Coronavirus Advice:

LIVING IN LONDON

Council Tax

Council Tax is set by local authorities to pay for the services they provide, such as rubbish collection, the police and the fire brigade. It is charged annually, although most people choose to pay it in monthly or quarterly instalments. The rates of council tax are different in each borough.

Council Tax Exemption:

To receive an exemption from paying council tax, every member of your household must be a student. If students make up the greater proportion of a household, it may be possible to claim a *reduction* in council tax, but it will not be waived altogether.

Local authorities can refuse to grant exemption to students unless they demonstrate that they are enrolled at an institution in the UK on a course that takes place full time, over a period of *at least one academic year*. This can present difficulties for CTLS students only in London for a semester, so you are strongly advised to consider the cost of council tax before you move, and plan your budget accordingly.

The <u>UK Council for International Student Affairs website</u> has detailed information on who qualifies for a student exemption, and the key things you'll need to do if you receive a council tax bill during your stay in London.
