REIMAGINING RIGHTS

As American constitutional jurisprudence faces a moment of significant change, *The Georgetown Law Journal* seeks scholarship looking at how rights, both procedural and substantive, are in flux.



Applicant Qualifications

The competition is open to all law students currently enrolled at any ABA-accredited law school. Students may be participants in a J.D., LL.M., or S.J.D. program. Eligibility is neither limited to full-time students nor students who attend the Georgetown University Law Center.

Submission Details

Submissions must be relevant to the theme of Reimagining Rights and should be limited to 10,000 words, inclusive of footnotes. Submissions should be accompanied by a separate document, which provides a brief summary of the Note, a statement of originality, and an explanation of the paper's relevancy to the theme.

Judging Criteria

Papers will be judged based on timeliness of the issue discussed, the novelty of the author's argument and analysis, the appeal of the topic to a generalist legal audience, the quality of the writing, and the paper's compliance with current Bluebook standards.

Prize

Up to two pieces will be selected as contest winners. Winning pieces will be published on *GLJOnline* in Spring 2023. The winning authors will receive a \$250 monetary award.
