Research: Experience using legal databases including Westlaw and LexisNexis and strong research skills.

Strong Writer: Ability to synthesize complex legal holdings into brief and accurate parentheticals.

Legal Skills: Ability to distinguish legal holdings from dicta in criminal case law.

Passion: Interest in criminal procedure, the mission of the ARCP, and getting resources for defendants without them.
