The [Institute for Constitutional Advocacy and Protection](#) (ICAP) is a non-partisan institute within Georgetown University's Law School. ICAP's mission is to use strategic legal advocacy to defend constitutional rights and values, while working to restore people's confidence in the integrity of their governmental institutions. ICAP's recent work includes safeguarding rights to free expression, assembly, and democratic participation; combating threats from unlawful private militias and political violence; fighting the criminalization of poverty and other forms of criminal legal system overreach; and defending the rights of young people and marginalized communities.

ICAP's **Policy Counsel** is responsible for driving high-impact policy development to promote and defend key constitutional rights and values. Working closely with ICAP's litigation team and reporting to ICAP's Managing Director, the Policy Counsel will focus on advancing policy solutions to the challenges underlying ICAP's impact litigation efforts. Successful candidates will bring meaningful public policy experience and exceptional legal and writing abilities.

The Policy Counsel's duties include but are not limited to: (1) conceptualizing and effectuating high-impact policy solutions in defense of constitutional rights and values across a range of issues; (2) engaging with public officials, lawmakers, allies in the advocacy community, and other experts in support of these goals; (3) writing reports, white papers, and guidance documents; and (4) ensuring that Georgetown Law students are meaningfully and materially integrated into ICAP's policy development efforts.
