



**Resolution 2019-2020-08: 2019 Revisions to the SBA Constitution**

WHEREAS the current Constitution has many grammatical errors,

WHEREAS the current Constitution has language that reflects defunct positions and information that is no longer relevant;

WHEREAS the current Constitution has not been updated in several years to reflect standard parliamentary practice,

WHEREAS it is the role of the Attorney General to “perform such other duties as the President or the House of Delegates may direct,”

WHEREAS the President and Vice President requested that the Constitution be revised to reflect grammatical and substantive changes,

WHEREAS the following changes have been reviewed, discussed, and approved by the Executive Board,

WHEREAS the House of Delegates will have a chance to review the new Constitution and submit changes for a second round of edits,

THEREFORE, be it resolved that:

The Constitution will be edited for grammar and beautification;

The following information will be added to Article VIII on Standing Committees: “All members of the Association are eligible to serve on a Standing Committee. Each year at the conclusion of Fall elections, the Association shall open up committee membership to the entire student body via an application. The Executive Board shall submit to the House of Delegates for confirmation a list of non-Delegate nominees to be added to the Standing Committees;”

The defunct requirement that the Appointments Committee shall publish a list of Student-Faculty Committees and administer the nomination process for appointments will be removed;

The information regarding the defunct Director of Development position will be deleted;

The information regarding the defunct Experiential Learning Committee will be deleted.
