Resolution 2019-2020-09: 2019 Revisions to the SBA Bylaws

WHEREAS the current Bylaws have many grammatical errors,

WHEREAS the current Bylaws have not been updated in several years to reflect standard parliamentary practice,

WHEREAS the 2018-2019 SBA delegation passed Resolution 2018-2019-3 on April 2, 2019, which streamlined and restructured the SBA committees,

WHEREAS it is the role of the Attorney General to “perform such other duties as the President or the House of Delegates may direct,”

WHEREAS the President and Vice President requested that the Bylaws be revised to reflect grammatical and substantive changes,

WHEREAS the following changes have been reviewed, discussed, and approved by the Executive Board,

WHEREAS the House of Delegates will have a chance to review the new Bylaws and submit changes for a second round of edits,

THEREFORE, be it resolved that:

The Bylaws will be edited for grammar and beautification;

The Bylaws will be rewritten to reflect the substantive changes that were passed in Resolution 2018-2019-3;

The following language will be added to Article VIII, Section 4 to reflect the addition of Wednesday Wind Down: “Wednesday Wind Down shall take place every Wednesday afternoon on GULC campus. The Social Committee shall organize the provision of beer, snacks, and other non-alcoholic refreshments by campus catering services. The Social Committee shall appoint a different student organization to host the event each week.”

The language in Article X regarding Membership will be altered to “At the start of each academic year, the Day Vice President will fill vacancies on the Student-Faculty Committees with the advice and consent of the Executive Board and subject to the approval of the House of Delegates. All Georgetown Law students are eligible to serve on the Student-Faculty

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Committees; however, preference will be given to non-first year students”
to reflect common practice;

The following requirement will be added to Article X to reflect common practice: “At least one member of the Faculty-Student Admissions Committee should be a veteran.”

The requirement that the Chair of the Campus Services Committee must create a Committee roster and sit on the Campus Services Student Faculty Committee will be removed from Article XI in order to reflect past procedure and standardize the duties of each committee chair.
