Georgetown Intellectual Property & Information Policy Clinic Clinical Teaching Fellowship (2020-2022)

The Georgetown Intellectual Property and Information Policy (iPIP) Clinic welcomes applications for the Clinic's inaugural Clinical Teaching Fellow, a two-year position beginning in August 2020. The Fellow will supervise students' case work, mentor and advise students, and assist in teaching the Clinic seminar. The Fellow will also contribute to developing the culture of the Clinic and participate in the Georgetown Clinical Pedagogy course that meets throughout the first year of the fellowship.

About the Clinic

The iPIP Clinic focuses on strategic counseling for individuals, non-profit organizations, and consumer groups engaged with intellectual property or information policy matters from a public interest perspective. The Clinic emphasizes creative, collaborative thinking and reflective lawyering. The fellow will also have the opportunity to help shape the Clinic's docket.

Resources & Benefits

The Fellowship pays a stipend of \$57,000 the first year and \$60,000 the second year and offers excellent benefits. The Fellow will be awarded an LL.M. degree in Advocacy upon successfully completing the fellowship. The Fellow will also receive support for scholarship and professional development, including the opportunity to participate in the research communities at Georgetown Law and around Washington D.C.

Qualifications

Eligible candidates will be interested in the work of the iPIP Clinic, possess a JD, and be admitted, or willing to seek admission, to the D.C. Bar. Successful candidates will have at least one year of legal work experience in one or more areas of intellectual property or information policy and demonstrate a passion for the work of the Clinic.

Application

Applicants should create a single PDF (lastname_firstname.pdf) that includes, in order, (1) a brief cover letter addressed to Professor Amanda Levendowski, (2) a CV, (3) a transcript, (4) three references, including contact information, (4) a legal writing sample.
