I realize that unless I decline the acceptance by 5:00 p.m. on April 23 (for the fall term) or withdraw by the required deadline in November 2020 (for the spring term), I may withdraw only by permission of the instructor and the Associate Dean, based on extraordinary special circumstances, and that such permission is rarely granted.

NOTE: In CALS, you will be working long hours (at least 35 hours a week, but significantly more during peak periods). You will be working very closely with another student who will be your partner in representing the client. Most likely, you and your partner will be working with a client who is a survivor of trauma or torture. You will be preparing your client for a deportation trial and handling the trial in court. Your client, partner, and others in the clinic will be depending on you. Some students may find it difficult to work long weeks with traumatized clients while facing short, court-enforced deadlines. If anything might inhibit your ability to perform these tasks, please discuss your situation with one of the clinic directors or the Dean of Students before completing this application.

Please provide answers to the following questions when you submit the supplemental application form:

- 1. What experience have you had that may make your participation in CALS valuable to its other members? (You might describe prior experience with people from other countries or cultures or with human rights or immigration law, prior experience in fact investigation, acting experience, writing experience, hobbies, or anything else you think might be relevant.)
- 2. Please write about any one of the following:
 - a. What is the biggest challenge, professional or otherwise, that you have ever faced? How did you deal with it? What did you learn from it?
 - b. Describe a situation in which you had a conflict with another person. How was the conflict resolved? If it was not resolved, why not?
