



Intellectual Property and Information Policy Clinic Clinical Teaching Fellowship, 2023-2025

Clinic Overview

Founded in 2019, Georgetown's Intellectual Property and Information Policy (iPIP) Clinic focuses on counseling and policy work for individuals, non-profits, and other organizations engaged with intellectual property and information policy issues from a social justice perspective. Each matter presents cutting-edge or novel questions while also operating as an effective teaching vehicle. Fellowship Description

The iPIP Clinic is hiring one lawyer to serve as a clinical teaching fellow for a two-year term, which begins in Summer 2023 and ends in Summer 2025. The fellow has several areas of responsibility, with a steadily increasing role as the fellowship progresses. Those responsibilities include:

- Supervising students' casework and taking an active role in supporting students' development;
- Sharing responsibility for designing and teaching seminar sessions;
- Assisting with administrative matters of the clinic;
- Cultivating a work environment rooted in hard work, trust, humility, respect, and joy;
- Participating in a clinical pedagogy seminar.

The fellow will be awarded an LL.M. in Advocacy at the successful conclusion of the fellowship.

Qualifications

Qualified candidates will have at least 1.5 years of post-J.D. legal experience and admission (or ability to be admitted) to the D.C. Bar. Successful candidates will be passionate about intellectual property and/or information policy, enthusiastic about working with students, and creative and kind in their approach.

Pay and Benefits

The annual stipend for the position is \$57,000 the first year and \$60,000 the second year, plus an opportunity to participate in group health insurance. The fellowship includes other excellent benefits, including a private office in the new Technology Clinics workspace, active participation in academic life through the Technology & Society initiative, unlimited access to our state-of-the-art fitness center, and professional support from many welcoming colleagues
