I am writing to introduce myself as well as to give you a sense of what to expect this summer as you look forward to the start of school. Think of my office and team - the Office of the Dean of Students (known on campus as "ODOS") - as a portal to the law school. We are a good place to turn to with questions or concerns, large or small, both this summer and beyond. ODOS is home to the Student Life, Residence Life, Sport and Fitness, Accessibility Services, and Academic Success offices, and our whole team is eager to meet you all on campus during Orientation this August.

Here's a snapshot of what's to come:

Orientation Week 2024: August 19-23

ODOS organizes the Orientation Week activities for the entering J.D. class, which will include everything from tours around DC with faculty to casual meals with upperclass mentors to your first law school class. Please note that the mandatory portion of Orientation for J.D. students in the evening program is currently scheduled for the evenings of **Tuesday**, **August 20 and Wednesday**, **August 21**, **from approximately 5:00-9:30 p.m.** (times to be finalized soon). Additionally, throughout that week there will be a range of voluntary-participation activities that will help you get settled and meet your classmates, from campus tours to meet & greet gatherings, as your work and family schedules permit. We will keep you posted on all of this in the coming 4-6 weeks.

Peer Advisors

Starting in July, you can expect to receive messages from your Peer Advisor, an upperclass student who will be a resource, tour guide, and mentor as you acclimate to DC and Georgetown. They will be available during Orientation and throughout the fall semester to support you and your transition into your 1E year. We know you may already have some questions about moving to DC and getting ready for the 1E year. Students will need to complete all required forms and documentation within this portal.

Otherwise, there's nothing you need to be doing now to prepare for 1E classes! There will be plenty to learn and read and do throughout the year, so take this time to relax and get excited about the exciting adventure you are about to begin.
