Student Immunization Requirements

Georgetown is committed to promoting and supporting the health and well-being of our campus community. As part of that commitment, and as required under District of Columbia law, Georgetown students who attend classes in person are required to submit proof of immunization documentation as further detailed below. Please carefully review the following instructions to submit required immunization and health information.

Georgetown Student Immunization Portal



Collection and confirmation of mandatory immunization documentation is coordinated by Georgetown's Office of Public Health in partnership with the MedStar Georgetown University Student Health Center. Students must submit immunization documentations and required forms via the Georgetown Student Immunization Portal. The portal is accessed via single sign-on with your Georgetown NetID and password. If additional communication with Georgetown's health team is necessary, messages can be exchanged in your account within the portal. You will receive a notification to your Georgetown email that you have a message waiting.

Immunization Requirements

Students who attend classes in person are required to submit documentation. Specific immunization requirements differ based on your age, history, and course of study. Your account in the immunization portal will automatically show the requirements that apply to you.

Students under 26 years of age and students requiring TB testing will require verification of health information with a form signed by their health care provider. Please allow adequate time to complete this step.

Age	Requirements
All students regardless of age	 Tuberculosis (TB) screening form to assess your risk of TB exposure. Based on your answers to the screening form, you may require TB testing.
Students under age 26 at the time of matriculation or, for non-matriculated students, at the time of enrollment	Documentation of up-to-date vaccination (all required doses) for: Diphtheria and Tetanus O Hepatitis B* (a dose of Td or Tdap given within the last 10 years) Varicella* *May provide documentation of immunity in lieu of vaccination
Students under age 26 and living on campus	Documentation of Meningococcal ACWY vaccination on or after 16th birthday, or a signed waiver.
Students under age 18	 Required: Documentation of vaccination against polio. Recommended: Signed parental consent for treatment of minors.

There may be other health measures and vaccinations recommended for individuals with immunocompromising conditions. These students should consult with their doctor or the MedStar Georgetown University Student Health Center.

Requests for medical and religious exemptions from mandatory immunization requirements can be submitted through the electronic "Immunization History" form under "My Forms" within the Immunization Database Portal.

Deadline

All required health forms and documentation must be submitted through the immunization portal by August 1 for the Fall semester, and December 15 for the Spring semester.

Failure to meet these requirements by the first day of class may result in a block on course registration and a non-refundable \$100 fee.

Fall 2024 Law Student Immunization Recommendations

The MedStar Georgetown University Student Health Center would like to welcome all students to the Georgetown University School of Law! We would also like to remind all students that they should complete their immunization requirements and tuberculosis screening prior to matriculation. To help complete these items, we recommend the following:

- All students should access their Georgetown University Immunization Portal through the Georgetown University Immunization Database portal.
 - This site is accessed via single sign-on with your Georgetown NetID and password.
- Your individual requirements will be populated in the portal in your My Forms section.
 - Students have different immunization requirements based on their age, history, and course of study.
 - After completion of your electronic forms in your My Forms section, please upload any pertinent records in your Document Upload section.
 - Outstanding items for completion are indicated by a red "X" at the top of your log-in section of the immunization portal.
 - It is recommended to complete outstanding items with a preferred health care provider or at the MedStar Georgetown Student Health Center prior to August 1, 2024.
 - o For completion, you must have all green checks on the top of your screen.
- If you have any questions about this process, please the FAQ section on our website.
 - If you still have questions, please send us a message in the Messages section under New Message with the Recipient as "1) Student Health Center Staff"
- If you still have outstanding items and have not been able to complete these with your own provider, the Student Health Center is currently offering the following options:
 - An appointment either virtually or in-person in our clinic to review your missing requirements and provide them as necessary. (Visits that start virtually will then have a shorter in-person follow-up appointment to complete injections or lab work.)
 - The Main Campus clinic is open year-round. It is located near the MedStar Georgetown University Hospital.
 - The Law Campus clinic will open Monday through Friday starting Monday, August 26,
 2024. The Law Campus clinic is located on the *lower level of Gewirz Hall*.
 - Our dedicated Immunization Clinic Days at the Law Campus Clinic will be held on Wednesday, August 21, 2024 & Thursday, August 22, 2024.
 - <u>An appointment</u> is necessary for securing a time during these dates.
 - Only GU vaccination/immunization requirement completion will be offered during these dates.
- To successfully make an appointment at any of our clinics, you will need the following:
 - To have an active insurance (the Student Health Insurance for Law students is activated on August 15, 2024) or private insurance (already activated).
 - o To have called our main line at 202-687-2200 to secure your appointment time.
 - o (To have completed the MedStar Health Registration Form in your Immunization Portal under My Forms—helpful but not required.)
