

GEORGETOWN UNIVERSITY LAW CENTER EXPRESSIVE ACTIVITY GUIDELINES

Engaging in Expressive Activity: Community members may engage in expressive activities, including those planned and executed with the intention of protesting an event, policy or other matter, in all Law Center campus locations regardless of whether the space has been reserved for that purpose, as long as the actions do not violate applicable University and Law Center speech and expression, time/place/manner, and safety policies. This includes the requirements that expressive activities not disrupt other University business or activities, curtail the speech rights of others, create safety risks, or violate a speaker's right to free speech and the audience's right to see and hear a speaker.

Consistent with these time/place/manner restrictions, the University and Law Center may deem certain spaces inappropriate for protest at all times, due to the nature of the space (e.g. campus safety offices, religious worship spaces, campus passageways, and the interiors of individual offices, office suites and residences).

Events: When hosting events, all community members are required to plan for the possibility that their event will be protested. This includes arranging for a trained speech and expression monitor to be present during the event if the host knows or reasonably should expect a protest may occur. The Office of Student Life and other Law Center offices will educate their constituent community members accordingly, and facilitate reservations of additional physical and/or electronic space to manage or accommodate protest as appropriate in individual circumstances.
