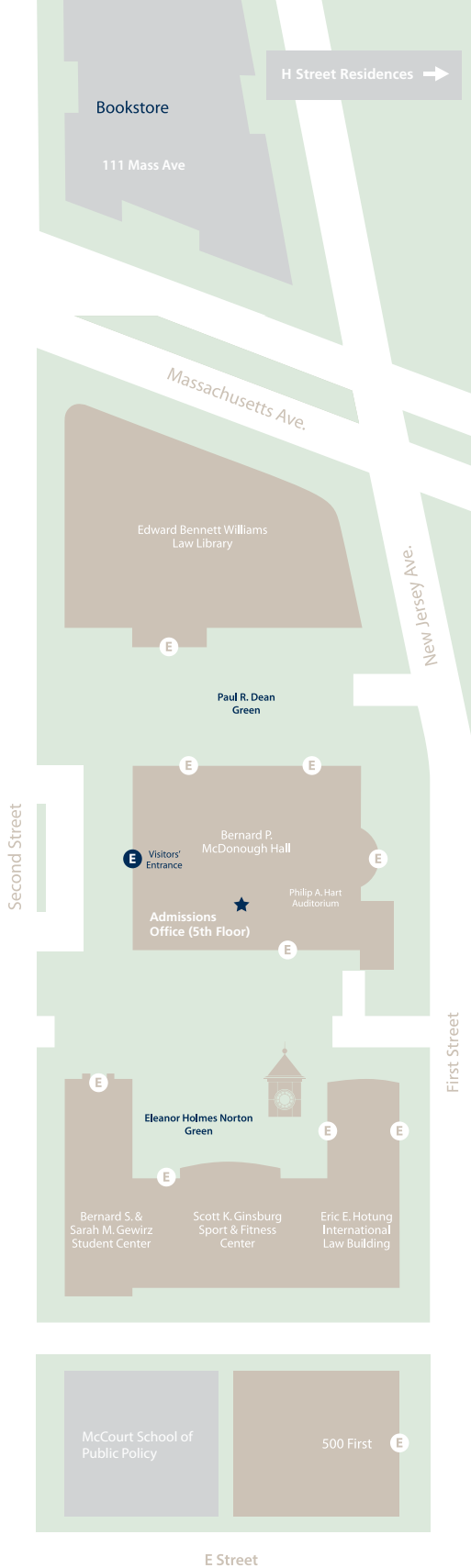

Welcome to GEORGETOWN LAW

From a campus located within blocks of the U.S. Congress that enacts laws, the Supreme Court that interprets them, and the agencies that enforce them, Georgetown Law's faculty and students enjoy unique access to the world of law and legal practice. The nation's largest law school nurtures both the rigorous exploration of legal theory and the development of policy solutions to society's greatest challenges. Our 17 legal clinics and more than 20 centers and institutes tackle issues from health, environmental, and human rights law to juvenile justice, national security, technology, and business law, providing students with opportunities to hone their research and advocacy skills from the very beginning of their legal careers. Georgetown-trained lawyers — "Hoya Lawyas" — can be found worldwide, making valuable contributions to the law and to society - from private practice to public office, business to academia and public service.



1 Edward Bennett Williams Law Library

Named for “super lawyer” and sports team owner Edward Bennett Williams, L’44 and dedicated in 1989, the Law Library is one of the largest academic law libraries in the nation, housing a robust collection of both primary and secondary materials in U.S., foreign, and international law. The Law Library’s digital and special collections include materials from the 13th century to the present, as well as the specialized tools necessary to identify and interpret relevant legal resources. A variety of study spaces and communal areas are located throughout the Law Library’s five floors. Please note: visitors on self-guided tours are not permitted to enter the Law Library.



Scott K. Ginsburg Sport & Fitness Center

The nearly 80,000 square foot Sport & Fitness Center offers a full array of athletic facilities to students, faculty, staff, and alumni: from racquetball courts and a multi-purpose court for basketball and volleyball, to a weight room, group exercise studios, and a four-lane lap pool.



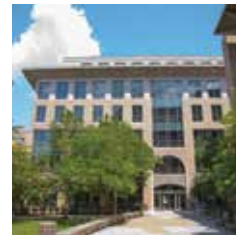
2 Sarah & Bernard Gewirz Center

The Gewirz Student Center offers one, two, or three-bedroom apartments for students. Each apartment is air conditioned and contains a kitchen, bathroom, and individual bedrooms. To see a model apartment, ask Residence Life on the ground floor. An event space is located on the top floor, while a child care center and the Student Health Center occupy the lower level.



3 Bernard P. McDonough Hall

McDonough Hall was built in 1971 and designed by Edward Durrell Stone, architect of the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. With its lecture halls, faculty offices, and student service space, it is at the heart of our six-building campus. You can find Hart Auditorium, our newly-renovated lecture hall and performance space, Campus Ministry, and a cafeteria and café on the first floor. Financial Aid and the Office of Public Interest and Community Service are on the third floor. Our top-ranked Clinical Programs are located throughout the building on the first through third floors. The Office of Equity and Inclusion, Admissions Office, and the Dean’s Office are on the fifth floor.



4 Eric E. Hotung International Law Building

The Hotung building houses many classrooms, seminar rooms, and faculty and program offices, as well as the O’Neill Alumni Center and the Supreme Court Institute Moot Courtroom, a near-faithful replica of the Supreme Court courtroom, where advocates can moot their cases prior to oral argument before the high court. The Office of Student Life occupies the third floor while the Office of Career Strategy, the Registrar, and J.D. Academic Services can be found on the fourth. The fifth floor is home to Graduate Programs, Transnational Programs, and Visa Services.



5 500 First Street

500 First Street offers a mix of classrooms, offices, and communal spaces. The building provides opportunities for cross-campus collaboration on innovative policy solutions across fields including health, climate, technology, education, and human rights. It is home to many of Georgetown Law’s Centers and Institutes and some McCourt School of Public Policy programs. Please note: visitors on self-guided tours are not permitted to enter the 500 First building.



Georgetown University Capitol Campus

Georgetown University Law Center also serves as the anchor school for Georgetown University’s new Capitol Campus. The University’s growing footprint on Capitol Hill includes the **McCourt School of Public Policy located at 125 E St. NW**, a 237,000-square-foot apartment-style complex at **55 H Street NW**, and the office building located at **111 Massachusetts Avenue NW** that houses the **School of Continuing Studies**, interdisciplinary programming, and a branch of the **Georgetown University Bookstore** that also sells Law Center-branded items. The university also recently acquired 77 H Street NW, a residential building with retail space.

Wi-Fi: The Capitol Campus is equipped with free wireless internet. Select the “GuestNet” network. There is no password necessary to join.

Transportation: Frequent shuttle services enable Georgetown University ID holders to travel between campuses and around the Capitol. Visit <https://transportation.georgetown.edu> to view the routes and full schedules.
