Frequently Asked Questions

GENERAL ORIENTATION QUESTIONS

Is attendance mandatory at all Orientation sessions? Can a student skip part of Orientation? Students are expected to attend all mandatory academic-related Orientation sessions:

- Dean's Welcome
- Myths and Realities of Law School
- Introduction to the First Year Classroom

Students who need to make a request to miss any of the above sessions should email lawdeanofstudents@georgetown.edu.

Attendance at all other community events is not mandatory (including the Faculty Moot Court and Peer Advisor dinner), but you're strongly encouraged to take advantage of all the great things going on and to connect with your new Georgetown Law community to the extent your schedule allows.

When/where should I check in?

Students should plan to check in on the second floor of McDonough (600 New Jersey Ave NW, Washington, D.C. 20001) prior to their section welcome. The evening welcome session is:

- Tuesday, August 18th: 5:30 p.m. - 6:15 p.m.

Can a student go to another section's Orientation session?

Students are expected to attend the mandatory academic Orientation sessions that are specifically scheduled for their section. Should a conflict arise and a student is unable to attend one of their section's programs, a request must be made to lawdeanofstudents@georgetown.edu.

May family members/significant others attend orientation?

We know how important partners and other loved ones are to our students. And they become members of our Georgetown family through all of you. Unfortunately, due to space limitations during orientation week, all sessions are for incoming first-year JD students only. There will be many other occasions to introduce your loved ones to the campus.

Is there a dress code for Orientation?

Students typically dress as they would for class throughout the week. However, for the President's welcome and faculty moot on Thursday evening, most students dress somewhere between smart and business casual.

Does a student have to register to attend the Faculty Moot Court program? Is it

mandatory?

Registration is not required. Attendance is not mandatory but highly recommended – a highlight of Orientation Week! The program begins after the Faculty Moot Reception on the Law Center and will be taking place at Gaston Hall on the Georgetown Hilltop Campus.

What is the Faculty Moot Court case?

The program features a mock argument of a case that will be heard by the Supreme Court this coming term.

MOBILE GOCARD

The GOCard is the official identification card of Georgetown University and much more! It's the way to pay for your purchases on and off campus. Use your GOCard to buy books, food, supplies, as well as gain access to academic buildings and residence halls.

BOOKS & COURSE MATERIALS

Where can I find out what books I need for my courses?

Buying Textbooks

Once you have your schedule of courses, you can search the Georgetown Law Bookstore for your course materials by Course Number. Course materials may also be posted in Canvas.

Readings and Textbooks on Course Reserve

Faculty may request that recommended readings be placed on course reserve. Course reserve materials may be checked out for a period of three hours. They may be renewed at the Williams Circulation Desk, unless another student has requested the same item.

CLASS READINGS & WEBSITES

Where can I find my first class assignments?

Professors typically assign readings to be completed in advance of the first day of class. Faculty Support will begin posting the first class assignments on the First Class Assignments Canvas page on August 15. Some faculty also list their first assignment on their individual Canvas pages. Professors may also email assignments in advance of the first class, so be sure to check your @georgetown email address.

If you have any questions about the assignment, contact your professor directly.

LOCKERS

How can I register for a locker?

Students will be able to request a locker during Orientation near the Chapel on the first floor of McDonough.

PARKING

Can I park on campus?

As you're planning your travel to and from campus during Orientation week, we encourage the use of public transportation within the D.C., Virginia and Maryland area. The Law Center is located near the Union Station and Judiciary Square metro stops. You can also utilize the variety of D.C. bus routes in the area.

Parking will not be available for students on-campus during Orientation week, but you are welcome to park in one of the local parking garages for a fee. Students will be able to request on-campus parking for the school year during Orientation near the Chapel on the first floor of McDonough.

PRINTING, PHOTOCOPYING, & SCANNING

Where can a student go to make copies, scan a document, etc.?

You can find information on printing as well as printer locations on the [Student Printing](#) page. You will need your GOCard, SaxaNet wifi access, and a [Papercut](#) account in order to print on campus.

STUDENT HEALTH & HEALTH INSURANCE

Where should a student go if they have questions about immunizations?

Use the [Student Health Portal](#) to review your immunization status and to see if you are meeting all of the university requirements. If you have a question, send a secure message to the student health team through the portal. Will the Student Health Center on the Law Center campus be open during Orientation?

The Student Health Center in 500 First St. will not be open during Orientation week for medical treatment. The clinic will be open on Wednesday, August 19th from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for the Immunization Clinic. Students in need of medical care may visit the Student Health Center on main campus and they may set up an appointment by calling 202-687-2200. The Student Health Center on the law campus will open on Monday, August 24th.

TUITION AND BILLING**What if a student has questions about tuition payments and billing?**

The Office of Student Accounts will be open from Monday to Friday from 9:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. during Orientation week in McDonough 581.

WESTLAW & LEXIS-NEXIS PASSWORDS**When do students receive their Westlaw and LexisNexis passwords?**

Passwords to LexisNexis and Westlaw will be given out by the Williams Library staff via email after Orientation begins.

WIRELESS INTERNET PASSWORDS & EMAIL**How do students receive the password information to access the Law Center's wireless network?**

Georgetown University's secured wireless networks are SaxaNet and eduroam. When you connect to them, your wireless signal is encrypted, securing your connection against eavesdropping and possible data theft. To connect, you must be on the Law Center campus, have an active NetID, and know your Georgetown University password. Our secured wireless networks support devices that comply with the 802.11n Wi-Fi and WPA2 authentication standards.
